It is with deepest regret that I have to announce the deaths of Jack McKenna. and Alan Ramadale, Alan was chairman of Solihull A C, he was an extremely active and much loved member, and a delegate to the league for several years. In Jack, we have lost one of our most cherished members, he was 84. 
