Concern at the state of the Discs being used in Division Two was expressed by Tom O'Reilly, however the new race secretaries thought they could either borrow or make do with the present discs. The possibility of changing the suppliers of League Placques was discussed with a view to saving money. After some arguement expressing the pros and cons of a possible change, it was decided to remain with our present suppliers. Clubs are asked to ask their athletes to pin their numbers on the sides of the number not on the top and bottom as this usually ends in the number folding and obliterating the number. Please help our officials by complying with this request. A. new rule was added to the constitution to form some guide lines to premeting Clubs when organising the young athletes races. Minutes.

Statement of Accounts.

The Treasurer reported that the League had made a slight profit of £1 - 17p. Ken Dare noted that there was no mention of an Honorarium paid to the Secretary / Treasurer. The Secretary reported that money was very tight and that the League could not really afford it. However the delegates instructed him to put the matter of an Honorarium on the agenda for future A.G.M's.

Some discussion was forthcoming on the subject of awards and it was agreed that

Ken Dare should make enquiries to see if the League could get a better deal with another company in the purchase of awards, but keeping the present standard of placque. The Treasurer proposed a vote of thanks to the Auditor Mr. David McNamee, which was endorsed by the meeting.

Acceptance of the accounts was then proposed by Ken Walklate and seconded by Ken

Dare and approved unanimously by the delegates.

Presidents Report.

Mr. E. J. Skidmere thanked the League for electing him to the post of President which he deemed a great henour. He had enjoyed the season visiting races in all divisions and was pleased to see the excellent competition in all three divisions. The First division was of a very high standard.
The President went on to thank the host Clubs for putting on races, the officials

for their hard work in running the League and Rey Tilling and Birchfield Harriers

for allowing the League to hold its A.G.M. at their headquarters.

Secretary's Report.

Division One. Held on the fast Gloucester course, the first race developed into a very exciting race between the evergreen Allan Rushmer and Roger Hackney. Roger eventually gained a two second advantage at the finish. Tipton (60pts.) won the team event by 5pts. from Birmingham University with Staffs. Mowrland third (71pts.). The helders Tipton had made the right sort of start in retention of their League title which they had held since the 1972/73 season.

In the second race held at Worcester Roger Hackney continued his winning ways again winning by two seconds, this time over Glynn Harvey (Staffs. Moorland) Revelation of the race was up and coming Birchfield Junior Darren Pemberton who finished third. The team race was won by Staffs. Moorland who finished six men in the first eleven to score the low total of 43pts. The University finished a comfortable second 95pts., with Tipton dropping to fourth (3rd.overal) some of their team away competing in the Europe Clubs Competition.

Held on the Parkland course at Perry Park, the third race was won by Tiptons Bob Westwood who stole the march on Mike and Martin Bishop (Staffs. Moorland). This win helped Tipton to their second League victory. So Staffs. Moorland, Birmingham Uni. and Tipton had come to the last race with a mere 43pts. seperating these three

splendid teams.

With the final League race held on the Tipton course the question being asked was could the National Champions do what they had the year before, come from behind to win the League title. Staffs Moorland had the simple answer to the question, placing there scoring six in twenty and extended their lead to take the Championship. The University holding on to second by just one point, this mainly due to Roger Hackney who scored his third individual victory. Roger has never lost a First Division Race

in which he has taken part in. Hewever, the leading runners placque went to Martin Bishop who ran consistently to finish 10th., 4th.; 3rd. & 7th. scoring 24 points. The Young Athletes races were won by City of Stoke A.C.. Only three teams completed a full team in all four races. All the fields for these races were disappointing with 37 athletes being the maximum to finish in any race.

C. Bradley of Stoke was the leading individual finishing first three times and 3rd once.

Division Two.

Welverhampton the host Club won an exciting tussle with Coventry in the first League race. Ten of the first three runners home came from these two Clubs, making it in effect two team races. Coventry & Wolverhampton battling for supremacy with all the other Clubs running for third place spot. Trevor Wright won the individual race from John Wheway both Wolverhampton and helping their Club to a 30pts. lead over Coventry.

Trevor Wright and John Wheway continued their winning partnership, filling the same two positions as in the first race. Again Wolverhampton won the team race but the home Club Coventry held them to the small margin of ten points, making a total

deficit of 40points.

In the third race at Leamington Blackwell kept up Wolverhamptons series of Individual winners coming home 15seconds ahead of Brown of Coventry. However in the team race Coventry started to pull back some of the leeway when they beat Wolverhampton by 26 points leaving only 14 points between the two Clubs. An

interesting final race was in prospect.

The final race at Redditch saw Coventry really meaning business finishing six men in the first eight, a performance that no one could match, on the day deservedly taking the Division Two title. Wolverhampton clinching the other promotion spot. Great credit must go to these two Clubs who both went on to finish in the first six teams in the National, not bad for second division teams. In the individual race the Wolverhampton Club had some consolation in providing the winner in each of the four races, this time Terry Colton had a magnificent win over Dave Moorcroft by nearly a minute.
